

Welcome to Marburg!

Here is some important information to help you get settled in your new home!

Do you live in one of the Christian-Wolff-Häuser, Friedrich-Ebert-Str. 111-119?

Your contact persons in your hall of residence:

Wirtschafterin (Housekeeper)	Your "Wirtschafterin" (housekeeper): <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Her office is usually on the ground floor in the lobby of your house.2. Her office hours should be posted by the entrance or on the door to the housekeeper's office.3. You can trade in your bed linen to her.4. You must inform the housekeeper when<ul style="list-style-type: none">• you move in,• you move out,• something in your room is broken.5. Your housekeeper can show you around the house. Feel free to ask her anything about the dorm.
Notdienst (Emergency Information)	Tel.: 0163 766 62 40. You can call this number whenever the housekeeper is not available, e. g. in the afternoons or at the weekends. You may call this number, for instance, <ul style="list-style-type: none">• if there is no electricity or water or, for example, someone has broken a window.• if you have lost your keys. Your room can be opened, but it will cost you 50 €.

Is there internet offered in your room at Christian-Wolff-Haus?

Unfortunately no. Talk to your neighbours and see if they have a private internet connection. Possibly, they will share it with you for 5-10 € per month.

What is there to do in your free time?

In Christian-Wolff-Haus, you can find a common room on the ground floor (lobby) next to the mailboxes. Here you can watch TV, read books, play cards, etc. The room is usually open and it's a great place to meet people and make new friends. You can also find a copier in it.

If you go through the common room, you'll find the door to the CWH bar. This is a meeting place where you can casually have a few drinks with friends, meet new people, get advice and learn new things from people at the bar, celebrate your friends' birthdays, and play at the foosball table.

The bar is open on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays from 9:30 pm (It is also posted on the door of the bar).

Also next to Chr.-Wolff-Haus, there is a picnic and barbecue area. Feel free to grill out with your friends, host a nice BBQ, etc (but please try and watch your noise level so that you are not too loud and disturb the neighbours).

Where can one go shopping in the neighbourhood?

You need to take the bus toward "Hauptbahnhof" (main train station) and get off at the "Stadtbüro" bus stop and cross the street. A little further south you'll find the supermarkets Edeka, Herkules, Lidl, Aldi, and Tegut.

How do I get into town?

You can take the bus from the „Christian-Wolff-Haus“ stop (directly in front of the house). To find out when and which buses leave look at the current timetables posted at the bus stop.

Do you live in Wehrda, Ernst-Lemmer-Str. 13 – 17?

Your contact persons in your hall of residence:

Wirtschafterin (Housekeeper)	Your "Wirtschafterin" (housekeeper): <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Internet-Tutor	<p>In House 1 (Studentendorf) and in the hall of residence at Fuchspass: Unfortunately, there is still no internet in these two residence halls. Talk to your neighbours and see if they have a private internet connection. Possibly, they'll share with you for 5-10 € per month.</p> <p>All the other houses in Studentendorf have internet access.</p> <p>In order to use the internet in your room, you will need to register the number of your network adapter or network interface card and your MAC address with your internet tutor. What is there to do in your free time?

There is the student bar **Schwarz-Weiß** ('Black-White'). It is a meeting place that is managed by the student association IFIKS e. V. for all of Studentendorf, Fuchspass, and other students. It is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays from 9:00 pm. You can meet new people, play pool, foosball, darts, hang out with your friends, organize parties, play music, and get advice from people. Dorfbibliothek (village library): Here you and your friends can play different games like poker, chess, etc. There is also a TV, DVD player, a copier, and books. If you want to use the village library contact the IFIKS Board (email: vorstand@ifiks.de)

There are many more free time activities! Just ask the IFIKS people at the bar in *Schwarz-Weiß* or in the Dorfbibliothek, and look out for posters hanging in the dorms.

Where can one go shopping in the neighborhood?

Only in the city.

How do I get into town?

You can take the bus into town going toward "Stadtmitte" (city center) from either bus stop „Studentendorf“ or „Ginseldorfer Weg“ (if you live in Studentendorf) or from bus stop „Sankt-Martin-Straße“ (if you live in Fuchspass). To find out when and which buses leave look at the current timetables posted at the bus stop.
