Self-, stress-, and conflict management

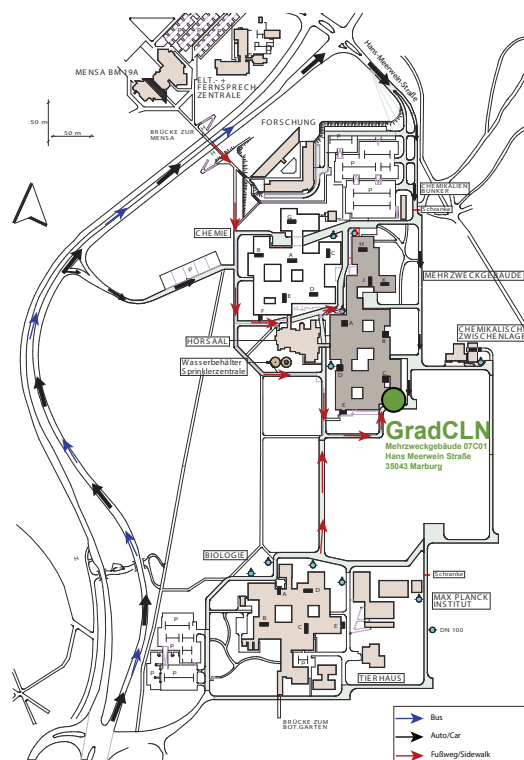
Career planning

SITE MAP



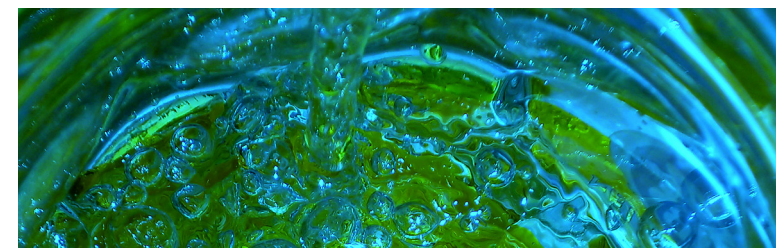

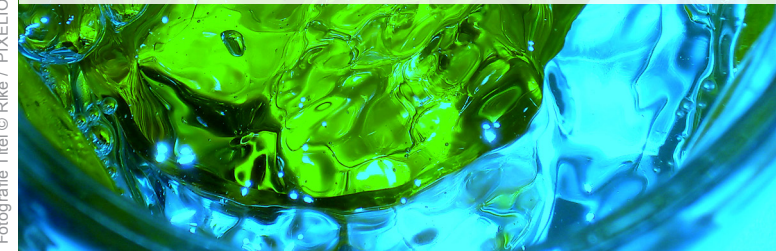
