Algeria, Bahrain, Djibouti, the Arab Republic of Egypt, the Islamic Republic of Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the Syrian Arab Republic, Tunisia, the United Arab Emirates, West Bank and Gaza, and the Republic of Yemen.

The Gulf states and the six members of the Gulf Cooperation Council (the GCC countries) are

Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates.



Algeria, Libya, Morocco, and Tunisia.








Military complex is significant in the MENA economies




MENA economics, on average, have a big problem with their Youth population!

Unemployment, youth total (% of total labor force ages 15-24)




MENA economics, on average, have a big problem with their Youth population!

Unemployment, youth **female (% of female labor force ages 15-24)**




MENA economics, on average, have problems in increasing economic and political power of women!

Proportion of seats held by women in national parliaments (%)




MENA economics, on average, have problems in increasing **economic and political **power of women!****


Renewable internal **freshwater** resources **per capita** (cubic meters)




