

Starting 2021, the Law Institute of the Immanuel Kant Baltic Federal University (IKBFU, Kaliningrad, Russia) in cooperation with Law Department of Philipps-University Marburg (Germany) launches a new English-language Crash course on the basics of Russian Law and the Eurasian Economic Union Law (REALs). The main idea of the Crash Course is to offer foreign students a set of courses (disciplines) that allow them to form a general understanding of the legal system of Russia and the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU).

<i>Mode of Education</i>	Distance and Regular learning (2021 in a distant mode)
<i>Location</i>	Immanuel Kant Baltic Federal University Law Institute, Kaliningrad, Russia
<i>Mission</i>	The training of specialists, whose future professional activities could be connected with application of Russian Law and EAEU Law.
<i>The Targeted Audience</i>	Foreign students wishing to acquire professional competencies in the field of Russian Law, as well as the EAEU Law. The Crash Course is also addressed to the law students from EU countries who are required to take a course on foreign legal systems.
<i>Advantages of the Program</i>	Students acquire the basic professional competencies in the field of key branches of Russian Law and EAEU integration Law, and gain skills in interpreting and applying these legal systems.
<i>Teaching Staff</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dr. Eugenia Gerasimova (Introduction to the Constitutional Law of Russian Federation),• Dr. Mikhail Avakyan and Dr. Alexander Salenko (Introduction to the Russian Criminal Law and Protection of Human Rights),• Prof. Dr. Vadim Voynikov and Dr. Tatiana Ezhova (Introduction to the EAEU Law)• Prof. Dr. Vadim Voynikov (Introduction to the Russian Private Law). Within the Crash Course it is also expected to attract leading external experts and practitioners to give lectures / classes on certain issues.
<i>Teaching Structure</i>	The each of disciplines consists from number of lectures and classes (seminars). Traditional lectures, by retaining their key role, serve for the theoretical assimilation of the material. In addition students get the opportunity to listen to podcasts and online lectures, to study of recommended literature, self-study etc. Classes (seminars) should contribute to the formation of skills and abilities to apply theoretical knowledge. Thus, lectures and seminars should be two relatively independent directions within a single educational process.
<i>Assessment</i>	All participants should pass examination for all courses within Crash Course. In case of successful examination the participant is awarded by certificate. The Crash Course REALs has been recognized under examination law by the Hessen Ministry of Justice (§ 9 Para. 1 No. 2e JAG).
