The seminar "Geopolitical challenges" addresses the multiple geopolitical crises from the perspective of European companies

Context of the seminar

European companies currently face multiple crises, such as the aftermath of the Covid pandemic, which still leads to lockdowns e.g. in China, the Ukraine war or the conflict between China and Taiwan. These crises do not only affect the economic situation in different areas of the world, e.g. through inflation or supply shortages, but they also have social, environmental and technological consequences, such as hunger, increasing CO_2 emissions, and a threat of deglobalization.


Not only, but also for European companies theses crises have initiated times of change ("Zeitenwende"). Change generally increases the level of uncertainty that is associated with economic activity. Thus, it brings new challenges, but also opportunities. However, European companies will only be able to benefit from these opportunities if they understand the geopolitical changes, that the current crises bring with them, and learn to deal with these challenges.

This seminar addresses these two aspects: It aims at

- a) shedding light on the current geopolitical challenges and their economic, social, environmental and technological consequences, and
- b) deriving strategy recommendations for different European companies.


The goal of our seminar is to understand the geopolitical challenges that European companies face and to develop coping strategies
