The Economic Policy Research Group at the School of Business & Economics seeks to recruit two

Student Assistant

for 40 hours/month starting 1st October 2022 and for a duration of six months (with the possibility to extend the contract afterwards).

The job involves assisting the Research Group in teaching and research. The student assistant will primarily assist the team members in the context of the seminars (Bachelor and Master), as well as within the courses "Innovation Economics" (Master) and "Wissenschaftliches Arbeiten in der VWL" (Bachelor). This includes administrative tasks, taking part in some of the sessions, and helping to advice the students. Other teaching tasks include, but are not limited to, supporting the Research Group with supervision of examinations or evaluation of courses. Furthermore, the student assistant will participate in current research projects in the field of the Digital Economy (Competition, Innovation, Privacy and Data Protection). This includes conducting literature reviews, collecting data and other research activities.

The candidates should study Economics or a closely related subject and should have successfully completed at least one course offered by the Research Group. Furthermore, an independent and reliable approach to work as well as interest in the research areas of the Research Group is expected. Good language skills in English and German are required.

We support women and strongly encourage them to apply. In areas where women are underrepresented, female applicants will be preferred in case of equal qualifications. Applicants with children are welcome; Philipps University of Marburg is certified as a family-friendly university. A reduction of working time is possible. Applicants with a disability as described in SGB IX (§ 2 para. 2, 3) will be preferred in case of equal qualifications. Application and interview costs cannot be refunded.
