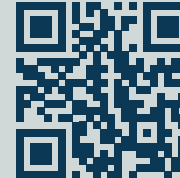
### Locations

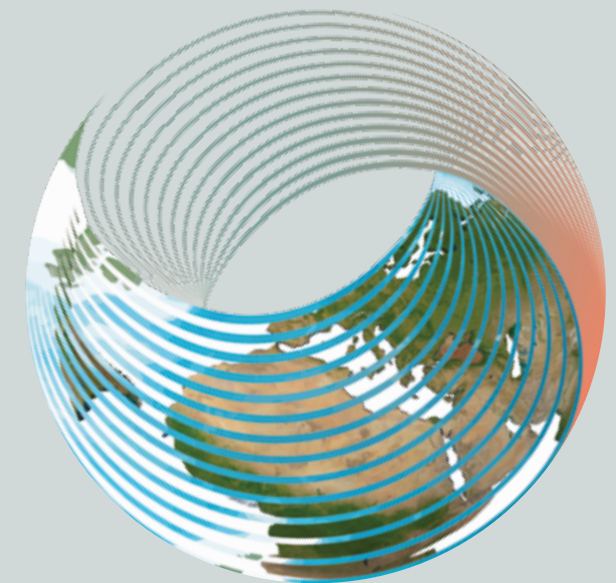
