- Students who have, within the last two years, successfully completed at least one year of full-time college-level study at a school in a country where English is the native language can apply for a waiver for the English-language test.
- Students who submit a minimum TOEFL score of 28 or IELTS score of 8.5 do not need to take the MACCS test.
