# The Emergence of Gendered Power Structures since Early Modern Times: Practices, Norms, Media

The conference aims to study the interdependent tensions between gender, power relations, and the state across centuries. Transformations, renegotiations, and revisionings in specific configurations of gendered power will be focused. The intersection of institutionalizations of state power with naturalizing gender discourses specific to the respective epochs will be problematized from manifold disciplinary approaches. A progress- and modernization-oriented master narrative of increasing gender equality will be confronted with the limitations and closures of opportunities to women through processes of formalization and legalization in the course of state formation until the twenty-first century. Such a synopsis along the analytical levels of social practices, normative frames, and medializations will bring to light distinct continuities, either in the form of 'invented traditions' (Hobsbawm 2019), or in the form of constructions of continuities in media representations.

#### Research Network GMS (Geschlecht • Macht • Staat)

This research network investigates the tensions between the guiding concepts of gender, power relations, and the state. The projects cover interactions between medializations, social practices, and normative framings in the attribution and negotiation of gendered (state) power in the process of historical change from the early modern period to the present. This interdisciplinary network consists of scholars from the disciplines of literary and cultural studies, media studies, history, political science and art history. It is located at the University of Marburg, but also includes scholars from the Herder Institute for Historical Research on Eastern Central Europe - Institute of the Leibniz Association, from the Justus Liebig University of Giessen, and from the Westphalian Wilhelms University of Münster. Funding has been granted by Flexi Funds of the Forschungscampus Mittelhessen. The long-term goal is to establish a DFG research group.


