After applying you will receive updates about your exchange regularly.



### 2 Application procedure

### Studielink

Exchange students <u>do not</u> apply through Studielink! Studielink is the website where students register for a full degree programme in the Netherlands. Application in Studielink means paying tuition fees in the Netherlands. Exchange students are in the Netherlands for a period of exchange only, they remain registered for a full degree at their home university, and pay tuition fees at their home university, not in the Netherlands.



#### \* Learning Agreement

Erasmus students need to upload their 'Learning Agreement' or Erasmus+ Before Mobility Form. This form should be provided by the home university, it should include the proposed study programme of the student and needs to be signed by two parties: the student and the sending institution (coordinator(s) at home university). The receiving institution (coordinator at University of Groningen) will sign when courses have been approved provisionally.<sup>1</sup>


**\*\*Course Selection** Apart from the Learning Agreement/Before Mobility Form, we ask all exchange students to upload the 'Course selection form', provided by the University of Groningen. On this form, students list the same courses as on the Learning Agreement. This is not an official document, and it does not need to be signed by your home university. This document is used by the study adviser for exchange students in the process of approving the proposed study programme. Therefore we require you to upload the course selection form as a Word file.

Admission to courses is not automatic and depends on entry requirements, language skills and the number of seats available in the course. It is wise, therefore, to select one or two extra courses in case you cannot attend a course of your first choice.<sup>2</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Even though the Learning Agreement has been signed provisionally, changes in your proposed study programme may still occur. To report these changes, you can have the 'Erasmus+ During Mobility' form signed by us and send it to your home university.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Courses taught at our faculty are usually not exactly the same as the courses taught at home. An exchange period is especially useful for taking elective courses rather than compulsory courses.


### Movin' to Groningen



### Study adviser for exchange students

- if you have a disability or special needs which we need to take into account in the preparation of your study period in Groningen.

#### **Special needs**

The University considers it important that students with physical disabilities, chronic illnesses, psychological complaints, dyslexia and other disabilities are able to study. Therefore, the University offers various arrangements for studying and taking exams for students with a performance disability. This could for example extra time at exams, writing your exams in a separate room or flexibility with attendance requirements.

If you already have such arrangements in your home university or think you will need them during your exchange, please inform the study adviser well before the start of the semester, the earlier the better! The study advisor will then be able to check which arrangements can be made for you in our faculty. Remember that we do require official proof of your disability, like a medical statement or a statement from your home university.

You also need to mention in your online application form that you have special needs, so your exchange coordinator knows about it and can contact the study adviser.





### **5 Language requirements**

Language requirements (other languages)	If students wish to enroll in courses not taught in English but in another language that is not their mother tongue, they need to send a certificate or statement from the language instructor at the home university indicating their (CEFR) level of proficiency in that language. If students wish to enroll in courses taught in Dutch, their level needs to be at least CEF B2/C1.	

### English

One of the problems many students from non-English speaking countries encounter, is the required level of English when they attend courses taught in English. In the Netherlands, the level of English proficiency is high, and lecturers expect all students in their class to have adequate language skills to participate in their course. You should have a level of English Proficiency of at least CEF B2/C1, IELTS 6,5 (with a minimum of 6.0 for each section) or TOEFL iBT 92 (with a minimum of 20 for each section) (paperbased 580). If your results are lower, you will probably have trouble understanding books and lectures and participating in discussions. The consequence may be that you fail courses or get bad results, or even that you are denied admission to courses or are removed from courses. In order to avoid this, prospective exchange students whose mother tongue is not English are advised to do the following<sup>3</sup>:

### Erasmus+ students:

- If you have done a language test or a self-assessment, have it signed by the international officer of your home university.
- If your level of English is lower than our requirements (see above), we strongly advise you to take a language course before you leave for Groningen so that your English proficiency is adequate before your arrival.
- While you are in Groningen, you can enrol in our course "Academic English for International Students", which focuses on academic skills in English. There are limited places available for this course.










#### 5.1 Other languages

If you wish to enrol in courses not taught in English but in another language that is not your mother tongue, you need to send a certificate or statement from your language instructor at your home university indicating your CEFR level of proficiency in that language. Most proficiency courses in other languages are sadly not open to exchange students. If you urgently need to be enrolled in a proficiency course and can send us proof of your current level in this language, we can try to place you. Placement is not guaranteed though, and you might be tested again by the lecturers before you can be admitted to the course. If you wish to enrol in courses taught in Dutch, your level needs to be around CEFR C1.





### 6 Student housing

The University of Groningen is not a campus university. Students have to find their own accommodation somewhere in town. As the housing situation in Groningen can be difficult for international students, have a look at the website <u>At home in Groningen</u>, before you start looking at the options below.

### 6.1 SSH registration

The University of Groningen has reserved accommodation with SSH. SSH offers basic furnished rooms in international student houses.

<u>The SSH reservation system for the first semester will open at the beginning of May</u>. Step-by-Step info on how to book a room or apartment via **SSH Reserved Accommodation:** 

- Register with SSH for Reserved Accommodation. For (Educational) Institution, select "University of Groningen (RUG)", for Department/Faculty select "RUG Arts - Exchange Students", and for type of resident, select "RUG Exchange student"
- The Mobility Office of the Faculty of Arts now has to approve your registration, after which you can check the rent offers and book your accommodation
- Go to <u>http://www.sshxl.nl/en</u>
- Click "I am looking for", select "Reserved accommodations" and select the city of Groningen
- During the booking process, you are asked to make the first payment (which consists of the first and last month of rent and the reservation fee, to be paid by Visa or Mastercard within 24 hours) and sign the rental agreement
- When you have successfully finished the booking process, SSH will send you an e-mail to confirm your booking
- Approximately 2 weeks before the start date of your rental agreement, SSH will send you an e-mail with arrival info
- Approximately 2 weeks before the end date of your contract, SSH will contact you about your departure, how to leave your accommodation and where to leave the keys.

### 6.2 SSH Rental period

<u>SSH offers reserved accommodation for a fixed period only, other rental periods are not</u> <u>possible.</u> The fixed rental periods correspond to the semesters at the university: Semester I: 11 August\* until 31 January or

28 August\* until 31 January

Semester II: 1 February until 30 June Semester I+II: 11/28 August\* until 30 June





\*The exact rental periods for the academic year 2018-2019 have not been confirmed yet. We advise you to check the SSH website for the exact periods when registration opens at the beginning of May.

Information about rental periods and cancellations can be found in the Terms and Conditions provided by SSH, so make sure to read those thoroughly before you make a reservation.

The first payment to SSH is non-refundable, irrespective of the reason for cancellation. Cancellation after commencement of the rental period is not permitted, except: (i) in the case of death, sudden serious illness or a serious accident of the student or first/second degree family members, or (ii) in the case of unforeseen withdrawal of the student's residence permit (if required) by the proper authorities.

Moreover, cancellation of the contract is only allowed if the abovementioned circumstance leads to a termination of enrolment at the University of Groningen. Therefore, a claim for cancellation must be made through the contact person at the student's faculty, which at the Faculty of Arts is your exchange coordinator.

### 6.3 Other accommodation

SSH is a reliable organisation. If however, for some reason, you do not wish to make use of this service and find accommodation on your own, please be aware that there may be untrustworthy landlords and unreliable room agencies. ### 7 Insurance and Visa

### 7.1 Health Insurance

The statutory healthcare insurance in the Netherlands is called the *basic healthcare insurance policy (basisverzekering)*. Most people in the Netherlands are required to take out the *basisverzekering*. However, there are exceptions, one of which applies to certain international students. ### 7.2 Liability Insurance

The European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) does not include household contents insurance, luggage insurance or liability insurance. Liability insurance covers any damage that you may accidentally cause to other people or their property. At AON you will be able to take out an additional insurance package; we recommend that you do so.

### 7.3 Visa


If you do not have an EU/EER nationality and are not from the USA, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Australia, South Korea, Monaco or Vatican City (country group 2), you need to apply for a visa (MVV) if you stay in the Netherlands for longer than 3 months. After you have completed the online exchange application of the Mobility Office of the Faculty of Arts, we will notify the ISD (International Service Desk) of the University of Groningen of your exchange, and they will then send you the required information and application documents.

Students from USA, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Australia, South Korea, Monaco or Vatican City can travel to the Netherlands without a visa, but do need a residence permit. After you have completed the online exchange application of the Mobility Office of the Faculty of Arts, we will notify the ISD (International Service Desk) of the University of Groningen of your exchange, and they will then send you the required information and application documents.

The handling fee for visa/residence permit applications charged by the Dutch Immigration and Naturalization Service (IND) for the academic year 2017/2018 is: Non EU students:  $\bigcirc 317^*$  for the MVV and the residence permit Students from country group 2:  $\bigcirc 317^*$  for the single residence permit. The handling fee will not be refunded by the IND in case your application is cancelled. Furthermore, students must meet the income requirements, set at  $\bigcirc 900^*$  a month. \* subject to changes



It is important to adhere to the deadlines for the Visa and/or residence permit application, in order to be able to travel to Groningen in time for the start of the semester. <u>This applies to students from all countries.</u>



### 8 Transportation

### 8.1 From Schiphol Airport to Groningen

From Schiphol Airport you can take a direct train to Groningen Central Station. The ride takes approximately 2 hours, every 3 minutes past the hour. You can also take the train 33 minutes past the hour, but you will have to change trains in Zwolle. The train leaves from platform 1-2 at Schiphol (subject to changes). You can buy a ticket in the machine or at the information desks at Schiphol station. A one way second class ticket costs about 25 euros. It is important that you purchase a train ticket to Groningen before you board the train. Passengers travelling without a valid ticket will be fined!





### 8.2 OV-chip card

The OV-chipkaart (a smart card the size of a bank card) is the means of travelling and payment for the public transport system in the Netherlands. You can upload credit or travel products (such as a single ticket or a seasonal ticket) at the machines at train and bus stations, post offices and supermarkets. You can choose either a personal, anonymous or disposable card. For more information on the OV-chipkaart, see <u>www.ov-chipkaart.nl</u>

### 8.3 Discount for transportation

International students can't get a student discount on train and bus tickets. Drug stores and supermarkets sometimes sell cheap day train tickets, in stores or online. We will inform you about these sales as often as possible!



### 9 Erasmus Student Network (ESN)

**Erasmus Student Network (ESN)** is one of the biggest interdisciplinary student organizations in Europe, founded in 1989 for supporting and developing student exchange. ESN is present in 452 Higher Education Institutions in 37 countries and this network is constantly developing and expanding.

The main focus of ESN is placed on **all international and exchange students in Groningen**. ESN offers help and support in social and practical integration processes. The latter is mainly done through the organization of a wide range of activities, including cultural events (international dinners, country nights, excursions to various places in and outside the Netherlands), social events (Monday night social, theme parties), educative programs (language exchange, career events) and charitable events. Check out the website www.esn-groningen.nl or the ESN Facebook page to read more about all activities ESN organizes and to see what's coming up.

In order to know all the ins and outs of Groningen and its student life, ESN Groningen has a **buddy** program. Your buddy can pick you up from the railway station, help you get through the first few days after your arrival and can help you with some practical things that need to be done. ESN will try to link you to a buddy from the same faculty. In this way, your buddy can tell you a lot about the faculty and the courses you are following.


