### **Course selection and freshers week B.A. American, British, and Canadian Studies (Winter 22/23)**

2. Course selection, starts on September 22, 2022 and takes place via the online platform MARVIN (<https://www.marvin.uni-marburg.de>). 3. Please note you must have paid your semester fee and have been registered as a student for at least 10 days before you can register for classes.
4. Freshers' week (orientation) begins the week starting October 10, 2022. There will be a couple of appointments dedicated to time-table planning, help with basic questions related to studying as well as opportunities to get to know each other. 5. The general introductory session for first semester students in the B.A. American, British, and Canadian Studies will take place as an online event on October 10, 2022 at 14.00 (sharp). This meeting will be held in person at WR01D05 in block D of Wilhelm-Röpke-Str. 6. As per current university rules, you are required to wear a mask. If there are any changes to this arrangement, you will receive a link via e-mail (make sure to check your student e-mail account).

### **FAQs**

- What do the numbers before the class titles mean. These are numbers used in MARVIN to identify the courses (Lehrveranstaltungen). They are not exam registration numbers.
- What does SWS mean? Semesterwochstunden is the time which you are required to present in class for a given course. You can find a glossary of terms for university at: <https://uni-marburg.de/BYRyN>
- Are the courses listed above sufficient to ensure that I can graduate after six semesters? Yes. Your entire course of studies has a total of 180 credits of work. You should take an average of 30 credits of work each semester. Don't overdo it in the first semester.
