



REQUIRED LEVEL OF LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY	Students may pursue courses in French and English: 1) Students with at least a B1 level in French (B2 for courses at EJCAM) may pursue regular French courses. A French Language certificate (TCF, DELF, DALF) is recommended but not mandatory, at least students should provide us with a signed and stamped statement from the Departmental Coordinator stating the level of spoken and written French. NB : For certain countries, a language certificate is required for immigration purposes*. 2) Students with at least B1 level in English may pursue regular courses taught in English. 3) The requirements might differ according to the fields of studies		
GRADES & REQUIREMENT	24 ECTS credits per semester minimum <i>authorized</i> 30 ECTS credits per semester <i>recommended</i> 34 ECTS credits per semester maximum <i>authorized</i> <u>Students must choose courses from only one track within the same department</u>		
TRANSCRIPTS OF RECORDS	If necessary, transcripts are sent to the partner University within 5 weeks after the exchange semester ends Possibility to re-sit failed exams in June**Depending on the programme / faculty, there may be no re sits sessions.		



INSURANCES	EU students: Should obtain European health insurance card (CEAM) Non EU students: Mandatory affiliation to the French Student health plan, free of charge on-line: https://etudiant- etranger.ameli.fr/#/ All students: Have to subscribe to housing insurance that includes personal liability insurance.		
TRANSPORTATION	<ul> <li>Arrival by plane: The closest airport to Aix-en-Provence is PROVENCE AIRPORT located 20 miles away from Aix. Students can take the blue shuttle bus N° 40, which goes directly to Aix-en-Provence. Airport pickup service is not available.</li> <li>Arrival by train: There are two different train stations ("gare") associated with Aix: the Gare SNCF Aix Centre-Ville is located in downtown Aix; AIX Gare TGV is the high speed train station located about 15 minutes by bus outside Aix.</li> <li>From Aix TGV you can get to Aix with a shuttle bus (ligne 40), which will drop you off at the bus station ("gare routière") in downtown Aix These shuttles run every 30 minutes and cost 6 €. <i>https://www.lepilote.com/ftp/document/fiche-horaire-40-en-bd.pdf</i></li> </ul>		
HOUSING	<ul> <li>Halls of residence: Renovated room: 10 m<sup>2</sup>, with washbasin, shower, toilet, and communal kitchen. Students will receive an email in order to register for housing on-line before their mobility. They will have to follow the instructions and pay a deposit.</li> <li>On arrival, students will have to pay for their room for the whole semester at the front desk of the residence.</li> <li>Students also have to subscribe to housing insurance upon arrival that includes personal liability insurance.</li> <li>Link to housing website:</li> <li>http://www.crous-aix-marseille.fr/logement</li> </ul>
