The 30th Post Graduate Course “Victimology, Victim Assistance and Criminal Justice” in the Inter University Center Dubrovnik will bring together around 80 students from all over the world and approximately up to 50 internationally renowned experts in the field of victimology, criminology and criminal justice. The course covers areas like crisis intervention, crisis management, victim assistance, victim compensation, restorative and transitional justice issues, women as victims of violence, theoretical concepts of victimology, newest developments in victim assistance, economic victimization, international victim surveys, victim impact statements, etc. Experience in victimology and/or victim assistance is welcome but not necessary since this course is geared to a theoretical brush up. The course will be taught in English.

In Dubrovnik, participants usually live in private quarters (room without board is about 15 to 25 EURO per night) or in one of the hotels close to the Inter University Center (IUC). The IUC is located 3 minutes walking distance away from the world famous old city. However, the participants are responsible to find and book their own accommodation

Lectures begin at 9:00 a.m. and last until 1:00 p.m. Between 1:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. is a siesta break and classes resume at 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. The last three days of the course are devoted to paper presentations by the students. Short presentations by the students of about 10 minutes in English language qualify for graduation from the course and lead to the highly desired certificate. The tuition fee for the course is **500 Euros** per participant and has to be paid **in cash** at the beginning of the course in Euro or Kuna to the course directors for the social activities and for the fees of the IUC and the WSV. Please note that this year the fee is unusually high since we plan for the weekend of the 17/18th of May an excursion and celebration of the 30th anniversary of the course on the island Mljet where we will stay over night in a hotel. ..It is not necessary to pre-register for the course at the Inter University Center in Dubrovnik. However, please inform one of the course directors about your planned participation and, if appropriate, the bringing of the number of students in order to allow us to plan accordingly. **Some of you might need a Visa coming to Croatia and for going to a neighbouring country. Please check this issue with your appropriate Embassy or Consulate since we plan for this course an excursion to Montenegro as well!!!**
