To get to know each other's families

Objective:	to present one's own family with the help of photos or to draw a family tree. This way you will also get to know the family of your tandem partner. Beginners can learn and practice vocabulary connected to family.
Language level:	A2
Word categories:	family, adjectives (of age, size, etc.)
Grammar:	possessive pronouns, comparatives of adjectives
Materials needed:	family pictures, paper, and pencils
How:	You show each other pictures and explain, what your relationship is with this particular person. For example: "This is my mother Carmen. She is married to my father Bernd."
	Another illustrative idea to get to know the family of the tandem partner is to draw a family tree of one's own family. How this can look like is illustrated as an example on the next page.
