Important: In some modules there is a choice of courses. Only one course can be chosen.

- (1) Once a module has been passed, it cannot be repeated.
- (2) Once a course has been selected for one module, it cannot be moved to another module.
- (3) Students are obliged to complete modules they have registered for.
- (4) Assignments assessed on a pass/fail basis (so-called Studienleistungen) can be cancelled at any time, whether they have been passed or failed, as long as there has not yet been any registration for the exam part of the module. Assignments alone do not entail an obligation to complete the module.
- (5) Once an examination attempt has been made in an elective module without passing it, disposing of this module in favor of another module is possible only once by transferring the failed attempt(s) to another elective module.
- (6) Once an examination attempt has been made in an elective module without passing it, disposing of this module in favor of another module is possible once by declaring it „utterly failed“ according to § 30 paragraph 3 of the Examination regulations.
- (7) Failed examinations may be repeated three times per module.
- (8) The Master Thesis may be repeated once.
