Contents	<p><b>Contents:</b> This module covers the relationship between demographic developments and its effects on economic and political stability with reference to MENA countries. The MENA region is characterised by a dramatic increase in its working-age population. This module provides a comprehensive review of the role of demographic transition in the macroeconomy of the MENA countries, investigating reasons behind the disappointing economic growth performance of the region. The role of demographic transition in the political stability of countries is also analysed. In the seminar context, include long-standing research questions as well as current issues are discussed, both referring to the region as a whole as well as covering the experiences of specific Middle East economies.</p> <p><b>Learning outcomes:</b> After successfully completing the module, students should be able to understand and critically discuss the economic role of demographic changes in general and especially in cases of high population growth as characterised by economies of the MENA region.</p>

It studies short-run phenomena, particularly the business cycle, and long-run macroeconomic phenomena, particularly economic growth. Macroeconomic theories encompass New Keynesian as well as New Classical perspectives. Empirical applications illustrate the extent to which theories are able to explain real world phenomena. Based on the theoretical analysis, appropriate conclusions for macroeconomic policy are derived.</p> <p><b>Learning outcomes:</b> After successfully completing the module, students should be able to understand and critically discuss different macroeconomic models pertaining to either the business cycle or economic growth. Students should also be able to pursue basic macroeconomic research questions with reference to the MENA region's economies.</p>

Contents	<p><b>Contents:</b></p> <p>This module studies the macroeconomic situation in the MENA region. On the one hand, general stylised facts are derived for the region, on the other hand specific country experiences are analysed. Important policy fields are fiscal policy, i.e. tax and expenditure policies, as well as monetary policy, including various exchange rate regimes. Based on the analysis of macroeconomic problems in conjunction with available macroeconomic instruments, potentially successful policies are discussed. This includes issues related to the outside environment of the MENA region as well as the potential for policy coordination between various countries of the Middle East.</p> <p><b>Learning outcomes:</b></p> <p>After successfully completing the module, students should be able to understand and critically discuss the macroeconomic situation in the Middle East. Students should also be able to derive macroeconomic policy conclusions with reference to the MENA region's economies.</p>
