Exams and grades

- Seminar/Tutorial





B-AOW1-Seminar B: LV-04-a50-047

Responsible: Dr. Edward Clarke

- Climate change, environmental protection, sustainability... psychology has a lot to contribute to this topic. The way we deal with food, clothing, money and energy, for example, or more generally: the form of our economic activity has a decisive influence on how sustainably we live. As importantly, economic systems and structures also influence sustainable behaviour and can dictate to us what is possible. Therefore, economic psychology has important contributions to make to a transformation of society towards greater sustainability. This seminar will take a closer look at people in their role as consumers, investors, and citizens with regard to theoretical explanations, empirical findings and intervention approaches. Furthermore, we will discuss and debate broader conceptual problems such as the role of the individual in system-level environmental solutions. The following topics will be discussed, for example: Consumption (e.g. food, clothing, transportation)
- Energy transition (e.g. acceptance of renewable energies)
- Investment/Divestment
- Citizen behaviour



B-AOW2b-Seminar B: LV-04-a50-151

Responsible: Emily Kleszewski

 This seminar covers key aspects of personnel selection, focusing on scientifically grounded methods for assessing and evaluating job suitability. Students will engage with various selection procedures and discuss current developments, their opportunities, and challenges.

B-VELPb-Seminar D: LV-04-a50-035

Responsible: Amin Jahani

 In this seminar, selected topics from the 'Learning' lecture will be analyzed and discussed in small groups, followed by student-led presentations and full-group discussions.
 Topics will be examined using guiding questions, case studies, textbook chapters, and original research articles.

Active/engaged participation is a key requirement. The main course requirement is a final paper, which should focus on selected seminar content.

Students are expected to review the corresponding lecture session before each seminar meeting.



B-VELPa-Seminar E: LV-04-a50-029

Migration and Human Development Responsible: Prof. Dr. Martin Pinquart

 The seminar applies main topics in the field of developmental psychology to young people with migration background, focusing on the situation of Germany and other countries.

In Germany, about 20% of the citizens have a migration background, meaning that they are foreigners, were born outside of Germany, or have at least one parent who has been born outside Germany. The percentage is higher in children and adolescents than in older age groups. In the first part of the seminar, we will discuss whether and how the psychological development of children with and without migration background differs, for example with regard to success in school, language development, social integration, and problem behavior. Factors will be identified that explain the observed differences. In the second part of the seminar, we will discuss interventions aimed at promoting a positive development of children and adolescents with migration background (e.g., in kindergarten, schools, families, or in the whole society). Amongst others, we will discuss whether mainstream programs for young people in general are as successful in children or adolescents with migration background and how specific interventions could be developed that focus on the risk factors and resources of children with migration background. The seminar will be held in English.

M-WPa/M-AOWb-Seminar: LV-04-c90-019

Responsible: Tijana Karić Zorić

 One of the most pressing challenges for societies today is to handle diversity within and across their borders. For example, today about 20% of all individuals living in Germany have a migration background. In addition to the fact that migration is changing the composition of a society, it usually comes along with conflicts between societal members, such as stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination. This is part of our daily life. However, apart from diversity based on ethnic origin, a group of people can be diverse with respect to various characteristics like culture, religion, gender, age etc. Although diversity is often regarded as a challenge, it is also an opportunity allowing cultural exchange and broadening creative capacities. This seminar will examine the social psychological factors involved in the challenges and opportunities of diversity, with an applied focus on selected cases and contexts.







If you don't have a digital Learning Agreement (dLA)

During the first few weeks of the semester:

Create your Belegliste in Mobility Online; for Psychology courses make sure that they are listed in "Marvin-My enrollments". During the semester, keep the list updated if you change courses!

By the deadline provided by the International Office

Make sure that the "Belegliste" is filled out completely, confirm the correctness of all entered information (for example course title, course number ects.) in Mobility online and submit the final version of the Belegliste, i.e.make sure that we can access it and make entries.

After completing the course (this regards everyone)

Make sure that for each course the lecturer emails a grade (or "passed") and the ECTS to erasmusstudent4@uni-Marburg.de (if you have any difficulties reaching them – let us know as well!).

Last step:

We enter the grades and ECTS from your Belegliste into our database to enable the examination office to print the **Transcript of Record** and **sent it to you and your home university**.


