



B-EXP-Praktikum A

Research Seminar A - Social Psychology and Climate Change Responsible: Dr. Edward Clarke

- An underexplored aspect of people's solution-oriented responses to the climate crisis is in how they are affected by causal attributions for climate change. People can attribute blame for climate change on individual behavior, fossil fuel corporations, lack of government regulation, or even capitalism itself. These attributions may depend on the level of system awareness that people have, that is, awareness of the underlying societal and economic structures that are at least partially responsible for a problem such as climate change.
- This ExPra will study how this system awareness influences causal attributions for climate change, and how this affects people's cognitive capacity to generate solutions and imagine alternatives to the status quo.
- Further information, including starting readings, will be provided prior to the beginning of the semester.

B-VBWSa-Seminar B

Psychopharmacology Responsible: Tianhua Wang

• In this seminar, we will cover a series of topics relevant to the Biological Psychology lecture series through presentations, group work, and engaged discussions. We will address key chapters from the textbook "Psychopharmacology: Drugs, the Brain, and Behavior" by Meyer J.S. & Quenzer L.F. (2018; Sinauer Associates), including (1) chemical signal transmission and neurotransmitters, (2) drug abuse, dependence, and addiction (e.g., alcohol, stimulants, opioids, etc.), and (3) pharmacological treatment of mental disorders (e.g., anxiety disorders, ADHD, mood disorders, etc.). The textbook is available in the university library. Additional resources and information sources will also be provided during the seminar.



B-VBWSb-Seminar A

Memory

Responsible: M. Sc. Lisa Marie Widmayer

- How does the human memory work and how can we investigate it? In this course, we will address selected topics from the psychology of memory. For this, we will work with scientific papers and guiding questions that we discuss during the seminar sessions.
- Participants hand in short texts (German or English) in which they summarize the discussed topics by the end of the semester in order to pass the course.



B-VBWSc-Seminar A and D

Social Psychology and Climate Change Responsible: Dr. Edward Clarke

- In this seminar we will utilise social psychological theory and research to develop an understanding of how people conceptualise, and behave in response to, one of humanity's greatest challenges - climate change. Theoretical perspectives in social psychology will guide our exploration of the formation of climate change beliefs, drivers of private-sphere environmental behaviours and collective action behaviours. This seminar will also adopt a critical perspective toward the current state of climate psychology as a discipline of research, with possible future directions in research discussed.
- The aim of this seminar is to highlight the importance of social psychology in helping us to understand how people engage with the challenge of climate change and the factors that promote pro-climate action. This will provide students with an understanding of how social psychological theories can be applied to real-world contexts of particular importance.

M-WPa / M-AOWb-Seminar

Diversity

Responsible: Tijana Karić Zorić

• One of the most pressing challenges for societies today is to handle diversity within and across their borders. For example, today about 20% of all individuals living in Germany have a migration background. In addition to the fact that migration is changing the composition of a society, it usually comes along with conflicts between societal members, such as stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination. This is part of our daily life. However, apart from diversity based on ethnic origin, a group of people can be diverse with respect to various characteristics like culture, religion, gender, age etc. Although diversity is often regarded as a challenge, it is also an opportunity allowing cultural exchange and broadening creative capacities. This seminar will examine the social psychological factors involved in the challenges and opportunities of diversity, with an applied focus on selected cases and contexts.

• The lecture aims at deepening students' knowledge of individual, structural, and organizational causes of diversity. In addition, after participation, students will know about the psychological consequences of diversity as well as the opportunities and limitations of a constructive handling of diversity. Students will be able to identify practical problems connected with diversity and to develop, implement, and evaluate intervention strategies.



M-WPb-Vorlesung

Change Management (second half of the semester) Responsible: Prof. Dr. Kathleen Otto

• The lecture aims at deepening students' knowledge of individual, structural, and organizational causes of heterogeneity and change. In addition, after participation, students will know about the psychological consequences of heterogeneity as well as the opportunities and limitations of a constructive handling of diversity and change. Students will be able to identify practical problems connected with heterogeneity and to develop, implement, and evaluate intervention strategies.



M-AOWa-Hauptseminar C

Health Promotion Responsible: Tuerxunhazi Yeerzhati

Change processes have immediate consequences for corporate innovation and health management. In the practical exercise, interventions are implemented in corporate settings or using case studies. This involves an introduction to the analysis and evaluation of work systems, as well as learning how to derive intervention proposals. Depending on the focus, topics such as work and recovery, conflict management, stress in the workplace, Work 4.0, leadership and innovation, and the resulting adaptation of research methods and interventions are addressed.





If you don't have a digital Learning Agreement (dLA)

During the first few weeks of the semester:

Create your Belegliste in Mobility Online; for Psychology courses make sure that they are listed in "Marvin-My enrollments". During the semester, keep the list updated if you change courses!

By the deadline provided by the International Office

Make sure that the "Belegliste" is filled out completely, confirm the correctness of all entered information (for example course title, course number ects.) in Mobility online and submit the final version of the Belegliste, i.e.make sure that we can access it and make entries.

After completing the course (this regards everyone)

Make sure that for each course the lecturer emails a grade (or "passed") and the ECTS to erasmusstudent4@uni-Marburg.de (if you have any difficulties reaching them – let us know as well!).

Last step:

We enter the grades and ECTS from your Belegliste into our database to enable the examination office to print the **Transcript of Record** and **sent it to you and your home university**.
