#### **Our Nomination Procedure**

Deadlines for Nomination: Full Academic Year / Autumn Semester: 1st May Spring Semester: 1st October

Nominations are to be submitted into the form sent out by the Incoming Erasmus Administrator in the UL Global Office. The nominated student's information should be inputted by their Home University. Nominations should include the students name, email address, area of study and the Erasmus code of the Institution.

#### **Our Application Procedure**

Deadlines for Application: Full Academic Year / Autumn Semester: 31st May Spring Semester: 31st October

Once the student has been officially nominated, they will receive an email with an application link and a guide to the online application procedure. Student's will require a recent Transcript, Identification and a recent Language Certificate to complete their application. Once students have completed their application, they will be e-mailed with further information regarding accommodation, modules, etc.

#### Modules:

A normal semester load at the University of Limerick is 30 ECTS credits. Most modules have a credit weighting of 6 ECTS so students should take five modules per semester. Erasmus students are required to take a majority of modules from their field of study. Erasmus+ Students can take between three and six modules while in UL. Acceptance on these modules is subject to academic prerequisites, timetabling constraints and number of students enrolled.

Modules offered in the area of Psychology, Sports Sciences and Journalism are subject to restrictions: only students nominated within the relevant subject areas may take part in those modules.

#### **ECTS Credits:**

The normal course load at the University of Limerick is 5 modules per semester. Erasmus students are limited to a maximum of 6 modules and a minimum of 3 modules per semester. Most UL modules are worth 6 ECTS credits.

#### Learning Agreement Requirement:

Students are required to send their Learning Agreement directly to their academic coordinator at the University of Limerick for approval of modules. If a student is using an online learning agreement they must enter their academic coordinators contact email as the responsible person in UL. Details of the students' academic coordinator in the University of Limerick will be sent to them after their nomination has been processed.

#### Language Requirements:

The language of instruction and assessment for all programmes in the University of Limerick is English (with the exception of foreign language modules, e.g. French, German, Spanish, Japanese). A B2 level of English is required and certification confirming this is necessary to complete your application. English as a Foreign Language course is available to Erasmus students as a module.

The Language Centre of the University of Limerick offers a General English Year-Round Programme which include standard and intensive language courses. This is suitable for students with various levels of English who wish to improve their general English language skills.

#### **Counselling Services:**

UL offers a counselling service called UL Éist Student Counselling and Wellbeing Service. This is a free and confidential service acting as a first point of contact for mental health needs. As

# well as counselling Éist offers Mental Health Education and wellbeing maintence via online platforms.

### Special Needs & Disabilities Information:

The student will be asked when completing their application if they have any special needs or requirements. The International Office will then provide the contact information of our Disability Services Department to any student who requires it. # Immigration information for incoming Erasmus students:

All non-EU students coming to the University of Limerick are required by the Irish Department of Justice (http://www.justice.ie/) to register with the local Gardaí (Irish police). VISA applications should be made through the Irish Embassy in the home country. **Immigration fee is €300**.

#### Academic transcripts:

A softcopy of each student transcripts will be emailed to the Partner Institution and the student, by the University of Limerick. The PDF will be signed and stamped using Digitary and issued within 5 weeks of publication of UL results online. Students may also access their results online vis the student portal prior to receiving their results via email.
