

Our faculty is home to three departments and offers excellent opportunities for educational studies in the following fields:

Educational Science

- fundamental theoretical, empirical and historical education in general educational science
- Qualification in the two main areas of social and special education, and adult and private youth education
- = career-related education through internships/practicals
- additional educational profiles in the areas of media pedagogy, movement oriented pedagogy, pedagogy of childhood, counselling, mediation, and supervision

School Pedagogy

- educational science course of studies for teachers in the area of secondary levels I and II (grammar school)
- integration of school-practical studies
- cooperation with the information centre for research of foreign languages
- education of sport teachers in the area of secondary levelsI and II
- integration of school-practical studies
- studies in the areas of motology, adventure and experience pedagogy

Degrees and Duration of Studies

The faculty offers Master-equivalent or B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in the fields indicated above. Traditionally students complete their degree with a Diplom degree or state exams referred to as Staatsexamen (Teacher training for the German education system). These degrees are academically equivalent to an M.A. degree.

The German university system is currently undergoing a transition: Within the next decade all courses will follow the B.A. (3 years) and M.A. (2 years) scheme.

Language Preparation

German language courses on all levels are offered in Marburg on a low cost basis. Preparation for the entrance examination requires about 800 teaching hours.

Housing A limited number of places in residence halls (fully equipped rooms for singles and apartments for couples) are available.



Landgrave Philipp founded the university in 1527 as the first Protestant university in the world. It started with four subjects: Theology, Law, Medicine and Philosophy. Today it has 17 faculties that offer a wide range of subjects in the natural sciences and liberal arts. Numerous famous people studied or taught in Marburg.

Internationalisation has always been a matter of course. Currently more than 12% of the student population are foreign nationals.

The University is an integral part of the scenic town of Marburg situated on the river Lahn 100 km north of Frankfurt. The town with its 80,000 inhabitants (approx. 50,000 in the centre) is dominated by the castle on the hill, its 18,000 students and about 6,000 people working for the university. A saying goes "Other towns have a university, Marburg is a university". It reflects the unique historic atmosphere. Wherever you are in the town, you are part of a vibrant academic community.
